

CLIMBING FRAME



Exciting new Climbing Frame now open at Lower Green Recreation Ground!

If you haven't already seen it, we are delighted to share that the brand-new climbing frame at Lower Green Recreation Ground has now been officially open since the beginning of November!

A huge thank you to Proludic for bringing this fantastic project to life. After months of anticipation, the impressive multi-play unit, is already proving to be a big hit. It's been great to see so many children enjoying the new climbing frame.

The new equipment has been specially designed to challenge and entertain older children, featuring double roll-over bars, a giant climbing wall, twisted rope climbers, high monkey bars, and a thrilling helter-skelter slide. Together, these features create the ultimate

outdoor adventure zone where young explorers can climb higher, play harder, and test their limits in a fun and safe environment.

The project was made possible through Section 106 funding, ensuring that local development directly benefits the community and its future generations.

Pembury Parish Council is delighted with the finished result and even more thrilled to see the local community embracing the new addition. The climbing frame marks a fantastic upgrade for the recreation ground, so if you haven't visited yet, head down to Lower Green Recreation Ground and see the amazing new climbing frame for yourself!



Section 106 is a rule that requires housing developers to give something back to the community, such as funding local facilities. Our lovely new climbing frame was funded by contributions from the Sturgeons development, now called Oast Gardens on Henwood Green Road.



Update:


Earlier this year, the Parish Council carried out an informal consultation on proposals to introduce double yellow lines at the junction of Maidstone Road and Church Road near the Primary School. The aim is to improve visibility for vehicles pulling out of Church Road and safety for pedestrians, particularly children and families during busy school times.

Following the informal consultation, the Parish Council submitted the results to Kent County Council (KCC), which is responsible for all highways matters and has overall authority for these works.

KCC then held a formal consultation, which has now closed. We would like to thank everyone who took the time to share their views during both stages of the process.

KCC will now review all feedback received before deciding whether to proceed with the scheme. The Parish Council will continue to liaise with KCC and will share updates as soon as a decision is made.

We know this has been a lengthy process but thank you for your patience and for taking part in helping to improve safety in the village.

SUPPORTING SCHOOL SAFETY IN OUR COMMUNITY



Having met with the Parish Council, I know they share our desire to ensure the safety and wellbeing of our children and wider community, so together we'd like to draw attention to an important issue affecting many families and residents: parking around our local school during drop-off and pick-up times.

Why It Matters

Congestion near the school can pose risks to children, inconvenience local residents, and create unnecessary stress for everyone involved. By working together, we can ensure that school parking is safe, respectful, and efficient.

What We're Asking

We kindly ask parents, carers, and visitors to:

- Use designated parking areas and avoid blocking driveways, pavements, or access routes.
- Keep clear of bus stops and emergency access points.
- Be mindful of residents' access to their homes.
- Avoid engine idling, which contributes to air pollution near the school.
- Stay patient and courteous, especially during busy times.
- Where you can walk to school, please do.

This isn't just a school issue – it's a community one. Whether you're a parent, a neighbour, or a passer-by, your actions help shape a safer environment for our children. We encourage everyone to be part of the solution.

OLD KIT ON A NEW ADVENTURE

We all know how quickly football boots seem to shrink when young feet grow and how often team kits get updated to keep up with new sponsors, new seasons, and new players. But what happens to the old kit once it's been replaced?

This year, Pembury Athletic (Youth) Football Club has found a brilliant answer to that question. Instead of leaving perfectly good kit sitting in storage or heading to the recycling bin, the club decided to give it a second life - thousands of miles away in Tanzania.

Thanks to a local contact - a teacher who is currently volunteering for a year at Hotspring School in Tanzania we were able to send a big bundle of football gear to a place where it's really needed. The donation included shirts, shorts, socks, football boots, goalkeeping gloves, shin pads and even a few well-loved footballs. Everything was collected from our players' outgrown kits and team leftovers from past seasons.

Before receiving the kit, the children at Hotspring School often played football in their school polo shirts, sometimes even using balls made from rags tied together. Now, with proper kit, boots and equipment, they can really experience the joy of the game.

Even better, all the gear was transported free of charge, added to the luggage of our volunteer teacher on her journey to Tanzania. It's a great example of how kindness and community spirit can stretch far beyond our village.

Our kit is now helping another group of young footballers to enjoy the sense of excitement and belonging that we do, and that is something that everyone at the club can be proud of.

Pembury Athletic (Youth) Football Club would like to thank everyone who donated, helped pack, or simply spread the word. This small act of kindness shows how our village can have a big impact - even on the other side of the world.





Farewell (but not goodbye) to our Chairman

After many years of dedicated service, David Hanes has stepped down as Chairman of the Pembury Society. It's near on impossible to cover all of the activities available to us over the course of the week but I will try and list some: the Festival Fun Run; inflatables; driving; 4x4 off road rides; mountain biking; quad bikes; pedal carts; archery; tomahawk throwing; target shooting; zorbs; 3-D design and printing; engineering challenges; climbing; abseiling; crate stacking and a zip wire!

We were allocated a pitch on 'Tropical' sub camp, where we enjoyed early evening activities such as neon night and a Christmas outfit competition (which we won!), plus a Tropical soapbox car competition (which we also won!). Not only this but we were treated to busking bands and groups performing on the main stage arena every night.

There was an amazing Opening Ceremony that our very own Jay got to take part in, and at the close of KIJ25 we experienced the most awesome Closing Ceremony with Scouting For Girls performing live on stage followed by fireworks.



32 Nations were represented across the whole event, and we met fellow guides from quite a few! Many kilometres were walked during the week (my smart watch tells me I covered 153km!); the high fives that we shared were in the high 100s, and we swapped badges in the 100s too (leading to 100s of hours of badge sewing for some adults I fear..!) The memories we made were countless however, and we will be talking about them for a considerable time yet.

It is wonderful that the different churches in Pembury are so varied. Here at the Baptist Church, we represent more the 'low church' end of things. Our Sunday morning services are informal with contemporary music and spoken contributions from a variety of people. If you want to find out more, all our services are livestreamed and available to watch on YouTube, and our sermons can also be listened to on a weekly Podcast.

During the week we're very much a Community Church with activities to benefit everyone. Tuesday Club is a welcoming day centre for seniors with lunch and activities. On Wednesdays our toddler group Little Rascals is always popular. Thursdays has Bubbles, our lovely sensory group for mums and their under 3s and every Thursday and Friday we open up the church for Kingdom Café which offers lunches, cakes and more, all free of charge (though we raise money for each month's nominated charity). Friday after school is Blend, our drop-in youth group. All through the week we host Pembury Community Larder which is supported by contributions from across the village. The larder is available by appointment and in confidence for those who could use a little extra help. To find out more about any of these activities and more do visit the church website or call the office.

Recently we have been able to resurface and renovate two of our outdoor spaces – the play area which children and young people can enjoy, and our quiet garden which is often used during the warmer months by the visitors to our café.

I became the minister here in 2018, moving down from Hertfordshire with my family. We love Pembury and are grateful for the sense of community here. With two dogs, it's wonderful to have footpaths through woodland all around us! A highlight of my week is being a volunteer chaplain at the Hospital – the one time I put a dog collar on (the clerical kind). I find it a privilege to meet people from all walks of life, albeit at a difficult time for them.

We are a church that is very much here for you so whether you're new to the village or have been here for ages we'd love to see you.



We love singing carols at Christmas, but many beloved tunes aren't truly about the Nativity. "Good King Wenceslaus," for instance, celebrates a 10th-century Bohemian saint and was meant for his feast day in September. Its snowy imagery and mention of Boxing Day helped it sneak into the Christmas repertoire.

"The Angel Gabriel from heaven came" focuses on the Annunciation, when Mary learns she'll bear Christ, celebrated on 25th March, not Christmas. At St Anselm's, it's sung in both March and December.

"In the Bleak Midwinter" paints a frosty scene more befitting the English climate than Bethlehem's, where snow is rare. Christina Rossetti's poetic license adds charm, if not accuracy.

Even "We Three Kings" misleads: the Magi weren't kings, didn't visit a stable, and arrived twelve days after Christmas.

Scripture doesn't specify their number - only their three gifts.

Still, these carols uplift and inspire. Their melodies and messages draw us into the mystery of Christ, even if tradition sometimes blurs the lines.

CHRISTMAS JOY!



A key theme of Christmas is joy. It's sung in carols like Joy to the World and printed on countless Christmas cards. But where is joy truly found?

Curious to learn the answer, I asked Microsoft Co-Pilot. In seconds, it offered ideas: relationships, nature, hobbies, mindfulness. Helpful – but it made me wonder: what's the difference between pleasure and joy?

Pleasure often comes from outside – gifts, gadgets, glitter. Joy, I believe, comes from within. Advertisers push the idea that happiness is bought, but true joy isn't found in things.

The Christmas story offers deeper wisdom. On that first night, an angel

told shepherds, "I bring you good news of great joy." The birth of a baby brings wonder and hope – but this joy goes further. The New Testament mentions joy 53 times, often in hardship. St. Paul, even in prison, wrote, "Rejoice in the Lord always." Why? "The Lord is near."

That's the heart of it. The angel's message pointed not to a thing, but a person – Emmanuel, "God with us." Joy is the echo of God's life within us.
