PEMBURY PEOPLE - DAVID KNIGHT

I have chosen to feature David Knight of Pippins Farm to tell us about his life in fruit farming. We first met in October 1996 at the Apple, Cider and Wine Country Fayre at the Farm, organised by the Pembury Link of Hospice in the Weald. I will let David tell his story......

I was born in Farnborough Hospital and the family lived in Bromley. My father was a wartime RAF pilot before working for the Valuation Office in Bromley and later in Brighton. I was educated at Tonbridge School where I studied science subjects and enjoyed rugby. I was always interested in plants and animals as a boy. My parents had no farming background. However there is farming in my blood as my grandfather was born on a farm at Ulcombe and my ancestors were there for generations before the family moved to London in the 1900's.

I came to live in Pembury in 1982 after living in a flat in Tunbridge Wells. I had been working for an agricultural consultancy business which operated widely, giving advice and assistance on farms in the U.K. This involved quite a bit of travelling, though as a new member of the firm I was assisting a partner initially until I built up my own clients. I was soon thrust into working in Ireland as the business took over an existing office based in Cork. Although I had a degree in agriculture from Reading University and a Masters in Agricultural Economics I had to quickly learn accounting techniques. Before long I was costing pig herds, dairy farms and tillage (arable) farms to monitor performance for business minded farmers.



After my marriage to Veronica in 1981, I continued to visit Ireland, but having obtained the farm tenancy in the same year I had to concentrate on activities closer to home. I had seen Pippins Farm advertised in the local press and with an ambition to farm I put in a tender for the tenancy. The farm was in a poor state and I was lucky to just beat the next highest bidder. I knew next to nothing about fruit farming but with most of the farm growing cooking plums and blackcurrants, which were long past their best, it offered an opportunity. The farm was owned by Tunbridge Wells Council who had taken it over from the local Water Company. Under Government pressure to sell non-essential assets we were offered the farm to purchase a few years later. As a relatively young sitting tenant it was a good price allowing us to invest with the security of owning a farm. We gradually replanted the orchards with Cox, Russet and Bramley apples and set up a "Pick Your Own" soft fruit venture. The first "farm shop" was a basic wooden barn that blew down in the Great Storm of 1987.

Today we have modern orchards of Gala, Braeburn and other commercial apples plus some speciality and traditional varieties – over 50 in all. We also grow cherries and a few plums. Apples go through a marketing organisation to the supermarkets.

Over time the regulations and inspections have grown enormously. In addition, the specifications are constantly being tightened so that apples are not just visually examined but cameras can look internally as well. Unfortunately prices have declined and costs continually increase so that the economics are now very questionable indeed. Who knows what the future holds?

On the more positive side we have managed to restore most of our traditional farm buildings, including a 3 roundel Oast, which is depicted on the village green sign. Several small businesses now operate successfully

from here. We have also made a horse training gallop and a fishing lake.

Until fairly recently, I ran a rural/agricultural consultancy business with a partner in Oxfordshire and staff based here. This enabled me to invest in the farm, as on its own it would not have been viable. I was also a director of various local cooperatives in the grain and fruit sectors.

Having lived our married life in Pembury we have always valued being part of the local community. We commenced Apple Day again around 2010 having resurrected our apple press and restarted cider making with the Pippins Cider Club. Over the last 3 years we have raised about £12k for the Hospice.

We are fortunate having such beautiful countryside around us, being in the High Weald Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB). Like all the South East it is under pressure but well worth protecting for future generations. In reality farming is hard work and subject to risks and setbacks. The land is enjoyed by many footpath walkers and their dogs as we are on the Tunbridge Wells Circular Walk.

Looking forward, we have two children who work and live in London but enjoy regular weekends in Pembury. Both work for international firms, Edward as a management consultant and Emily as an employment solicitor. This year we have our second farm wedding reception- very convenient for the Old Church.

Veronica has had a successful legal career, initially as a barrister and latterly as a judge. She has recently retired but is still continuing to do some part-time work and is involved with school governance.

When children are young there is little time for hobbies but in the last twenty years I have gone back to sailing, both in my own small dinghy and also as crew on larger boats when the opportunity arises. Gardening is becoming of more interest and we are planning to grow some of the flowers for this year's wedding.

Thank you David for sharing your story and for your contribution to the local community.



The criminal's aim is to obtain financial information to enable them to empty bank accounts through money transfers or the purchase of goods and services.



The most common scams arrive by email. Here's what to look out for...

- General greeting like 'dear customer'
- Sense of urgency, ie 'act now or your account will be closed'
- Prominent website links can be forged to look similar to the proper address. One different letter means a different website
- Request for personal information such as user name, password or bank details
- Poor spelling and grammar
- Text is contained within an image
- You weren't expecting an email from the company that appears to have sent it

WHAT TO DO IF YOU RECEIVE A SCAM EMAIL

- Do not reply or contact the sender
- Do not click on links or open attachments
- If you have already clicked on a link and opened a website, do not give out any personal information
- Delete it!

CHILDHOOD ANTICS

It may very well be that many people who now live in the Parish have never heard of Gouches Lake, and even I am not certain that I have spelt it right. However, when we were in our early teens a lot of our fun was had on and around the lake which was situated down in the woods below Wellgrove Stables. I don't know if it is still there. The lake had a very high steep bank on one side and a stream came in at one end and out over a stone block at the other. There were quite a few in our gang then and I hope they do not mind me mentioning their names, some of whom still live in the village, my dear friend Michael Waterman and his brother Richard, Mick and Peter Hillier, Barry Grainger, Melvyn Cole, Roger Fenner, Graham Chandler, Peter Giles and Bob Sellings to name a few.

Sometimes we would go to the lake and dam it up and then plant as many bangers (fireworks) and cherry bangers which were used to scare birds off the cherry crop, as we could get. The next step was to somehow light the fuse and run like hell and destroy the dam. But our main object was to build a raft. We knew what we wanted but to get the required items was a little more difficult. We needed at least six, empty five gallon oil drums which we eventually found on one of the tips on the outskirts of the village, but we still had to get them back to the lake and hide them. The next thing was wood for the main supports to attach the oil drums to, which we did with string and wire. But, where could we get the timber from to make the deck to fix to the frame and drums? Purely by luck one of the lads noticed that either demolition or reworking of some sort was being carried out on an old bungalow up by the old brick yard which used to be up the lane behind what was the Royal Oak pub.

Taking extreme care not be seen we crept up the lane and removed some of the floor boards which had been taken up. We then had the task of getting them round to the lake, which was quite some distance from there. We could now set about completing our task and it was with some triumph that after a lot of sweat and hard work we managed to get it in to the water. Of course we all wanted to be first but it was a little unstable. We then realised something was wrong because the raft was getting lower and lower in the water. In our attempts to fix the oil drums to the frame we had pierced the skin of the drums and water was getting in. At this point, we had to wave goodbye to some of our tackle much to mine and Michael's annoyance!!

One day we had decided to go fishing round the lake and we decided that we would use two of the spare oil drums we had as seats. And so we launched; Michael sat at one end and me at the other. We hadn't been on the lake very long when one of us caught a fish, I cannot remember whether it was me or Mick but he got up and walked to my end of the raft, when without warning the raft started to submerge, as gracefully as a Trident submarine. There we were, in the middle of the lake, fishing rods and kit in the water being dragged down by mud and water but we managed to get to the shore. Although this was the end of our ship building ambitions on Gouches Lake, it was a place that we loved visiting.





DAVID PARRY 1916 - 2016

"He has been here so long he has become an institution," David's manager said on his retirement from the bank. He subsequently moved to Pembury and lived in the village longer than anywhere else in his life. "He was a legend," said the lady at the Rec to our daughter who was enjoying the play equipment with her two young children on the morning of Dad's funeral. David Parry was a character, well known in the village, his home for the last 40 years.

He was born in China to parents who were missionaries with the China Inland Mission. He lived there until leaving school aged 17 to start work. He had already been acquainted with this part of Kent when his parents took a year's break and stayed at the Mission's chalet in Bidborough where David first attended school. He returned there for several other holidays after the war.

His career took him to several central London banks before six years active service in the London Corps of Signals during the war. He was in France and Belgium with the British Expeditionary





After retirement, he and Rosalie moved to Pembury to be near his mother who was, by then, living in the old Cornford House. From their Highfield Close home they took an active role in village life with the Baptist Church, the W.I. market and the footpath committee. After Rosalie's death in 1988 David remained active and was a familiar sight in the High Street most days.

His holiday adventures in his 70s included walking Hadrian's Wall by himself and revisiting China for ten weeks, spending much of that time visiting the places where his parents had served as missionaries.

He took an active interest in local news and also wrote to national newspapers with topical anecdotes.

Following a spell in Pembury Hospital, after breaking his femur two years ago, he moved to Cornford House, loved by staff and visitors alike. Family trips to Pembury took him back out into the High Street in his wheelchair with regular visits to the Tuesday village market.

He was just a few weeks short of his 100th birthday at his death but was quite ready to go to his heavenly home. As a family we are so grateful for so many of you in Pembury who took an interest in his adventurous life and shared his friendship.

There is a single slab slanted circle that runs around the perimeter of the plot which visually encloses the area while keeping access easy. Within this we have planted a few screening trees to the rear and I hope you enjoy the splash of spring colour the pairs of Cherries and Magnolia's bring.

Access was an important part of our brief and we have now extended a new path up to the edge of the pavement and dropped the overall height of each step. The new paving, sets the lighter colour of the actual memorial itself off well, especially after its steam clean.

We at Verdant View were proud to be asked to do this project and I hope that everyone appreciates the renovated area.

FUN AT ROWLEY HILL

In hindsight, as kids, we did many things which were considered extremely dangerous (as I'm sure many readers did too!).

No doubt many parishioners can still remember Rowley Hill as it was before the bypass went through to Colts Hill from Woodsgate Corner. When we were kids we all had trolleys which you could sit on and steer. These were normally constructed of a wooden box of some sort and a piece of wood, normally about 9" wide, 2" thick and about 5' long – the box being about 2' long.

The next step was to find two sets of wheels that were mounted on axles and these were normally found on old wheelchairs or pushchairs. Unfortunately these could be difficult to get hold of so we would go and see what had been deposited at one of the dumps. One of the axles and pairs of wheels would be nailed or screw fixed to the underneath of the box. The next part of the project was to find a piece of wood about an inch thick, 6" wide and just a bit narrower than the distance between the pair of wheels. We would then drill a hole through the centre of the piece of wood and through the main piece of wood. The next task was to bolt the two pieces of wood together but leaving the nut and bolt a little loose in order that the smaller piece of wood could be moved in either direction. We then screwed the other axle and pair of wheels to the underside of the wood. Finally we had to attach each end of a thick piece of string to each end on the top side of the wood.

Next we would sit on the box with our legs outstretched. Our feet were the main method of steering the cart but not forgetting the piece of rope that we held in both hands. There were no brakes and there were only two options of slowing the cart down: one was with your hands if we were travelling slowly but if we had gathered speed we had to drag our feet. Or of course we could wait until we hit something or tipped it over!!

At Rowley Hill the challenge was to see if you could let go at the top of the hill and reach or go past the bottom end of Pembury Walks. Unfortunately there were two obstacles — one was the grass triangle and the other the slight right hand bend at the bottom. When my father found out what we were doing, he banned me from doing this. I took no notice and three of us went down the hill on one trolley! The road had just been freshly re-gritted but off we went. It was fine until we got to the bottom bend and we were going too fast to stop. Over we went, elbows, knees and hands dragging along the grit; holes torn in our jeans and much damage to our hands and fingers.

We eventually came to a halt, moaning and groaning but that was not the worst bit. That was going home to tell my father. Enough to say that I was confined to barracks and the back garden for two weeks and that hurt even more!!!

- Continuing to have a member of staff covertly visit some sites at weekends and the hit squad also remains on standby.
- No out of the ordinary reporting of fly tips or bonfires.
- Total material collected in November = 34.95 tonnes (Domestic = 28.51 tonnes & Compostable = 6.44 tonnes), but totals affected by the depot fire, for the same period last year, the waste collected was 132.07 tonnes.



Total December material collected = 29.40 tonnes (Domestic = 25.10 tonnes & Compostable = 4.30 tonnes), but totals affected by the reduced round scheduling, for the same period last year the waste collected was 87.30 tonnes.

RECIPES



CHICKEN WITH LEMON AND HERBS

50g (2oz) butter juice of 1 lemon 2 spring onions 4 chicken thighs

15ml (1tbspn) chopped fresh tarragon salt and ground black pepper

15ml (1tbsp) chopped fresh dill

- 1. In a small pan, heat the butter until melted, remove from the heat and add the chopped onion, tarragon and dill. Season with salt and pepper;
- 2. Pre-heat the grill to medium. Brush the chicken with the herb mixture. Grill for 10-12 minutes. Turn the chicken over, baste and cook for a further 10-12 minutes or until the juices run clear;

Serve with new potatoes and salad.



LEMON MERINGUE PIE

1 packet coconut crisp biscuits 115g (4oz) butter

- 1. Melt the butter in a saucepan and crush the biscuits with a rolling pin
- 2. Add the crushed biscuits to the butter and mix well
- 3. Press the biscuit mix into a dish and refrigerate for about 20-25 mins

For the filling: 50g (20z) cornflour 175g (60z) caster sugar finely grated rind and juice of 2 lemons 2 egg yolks

Now any number this high is a little worrying but we have to hope that it is a one-off and not the future trend.

What we do not want is for the average to keep moving up. I went back through some of my previous records and found some as low as 38 for one quarter in 2003 and then another for 74 in the same year. Our average is gradually creeping up but not at an alarming rate, although any increase is not good. Thankfully criminal damage only increased from 9 to 10 but theft offences increased from 14 to 20 and again, without having the details some of them may have been avoided by taking better precautions with our property. Unfortunately and there is no point in hiding the figure, violent crime has reared its ugly head again. The figure rising from 23

to 36. Please remember, as I said before many of these will have been in the two main sections of Domestic Crime but we must somehow ensure this figure comes down.

We also need to look at the very irritating and annoying amount of dog fouling that is occurring around the village, on public footpaths, churchyards and play areas to say the least. Let us hope that the powers that be double the penalties for such offences, same as litter dropping. Fly tipping around the village and in the woodlands, from washing machines, fridges and mattresses is still very much a problem and an annoyance. Unfortunately the poor landowner gets lumbered with the cost of disposal if it's on his land or the Borough Council if it's on the Highway. If you see it happening don't get involved but telephone the registration number of the vehicle to the Police or the Council.

Let us keep this village clean and be careful out there.
